

Bound for a Blue Ribbon!



A mystery quilt pattern by Debbie Caffrey
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There are two sizes included in the instructions for this quilt. The information for the larger quilt is given first, and it is followed by the smaller quilt information written in parentheses. Choose the size you want to make, purchase fabric accordingly, and cut the pieces necessary for the size you are making.

The larger quilt measures $83\frac{3}{8}$ " x $100\frac{3}{8}$ " when completed as directed.
The smaller quilt measures $62\frac{5}{8}$ " x $75\frac{3}{8}$ " when completed as directed.

Fabric Requirements:

	Fabric #1 – light background	3 (2) yards
	Fabric #2 – focus fabric	1$\frac{5}{8}$ (1) yards
	Fabric #3 – medium/medium dark accent fabric	1$\frac{1}{2}$ (1) yards
	Fabric #4 – dark accent	1$\frac{1}{4}$ ($\frac{7}{8}$) yards
	First (Inner) Border – use more of fabric #4 or another	1$\frac{1}{4}$ ($\frac{3}{4}$) yards
	Second (Outer) Border – use more of fabric #2 or another	2$\frac{1}{2}$ (2) yards
	Backing	7$\frac{3}{4}$ (4$\frac{3}{4}$) yards
	Binding	1 ($\frac{3}{4}$) yard

Other Supplies to Complete the Quilt:

Sewing machine
Thread to blend with your fabrics
Rotary cutter, mat, & basic ruler(s)

Bring basic sewing notions, scissors, pins, rulers, thread/bobbin, etc.
Please have your cutting done prior to class so you can have more time for sewing in class!

Cutting

Fabric #1

Cut one (one) strip $9\frac{3}{4}$ " ($7\frac{5}{8}$ ") wide.

Cut this strip into four (four) $9\frac{3}{4}$ " ($7\frac{5}{8}$ ") squares.

Cut the squares twice, diagonally, into quarter-square triangles. Yield: 16 triangles



Cut four (three) strips 9" ($6\frac{7}{8}$ ") wide.

Use these strips to cut fourteen 9" ($6\frac{7}{8}$ ") squares.

Cut two (one) strips $7\frac{1}{4}$ " ($5\frac{3}{4}$ ") wide.

Cut the strips into six (six) $7\frac{1}{4}$ " ($5\frac{3}{4}$ ") squares.

Cut each square twice, diagonally, into quarter-square triangles. Yield: 24 triangles



Cut thirteen (twelve) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (2") wide.

Reserve seven (seven) strips for strip-piecing.

Use the remaining six (five) strips to cut forty-eight (forty-eight) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (2" x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ") rectangles.

Fabric #2

Cut seven (five) strips $6\frac{7}{8}$ " ($5\frac{3}{8}$ ") wide.

Cut these strips into thirty-one (thirty-one) $6\frac{7}{8}$ " ($5\frac{3}{8}$ ") squares.

Cut each square once, diagonally, into half-square triangles. Yield: 62 triangles



Fabric #3

Cut two (two) strips $4\frac{1}{2}$ " ($3\frac{1}{2}$ ") wide.

Cut thirteen (ten) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (2") wide.

Reserve seven (five) strips for strip-piecing.

Use the remaining six (five) strips to cut ninety-six (ninety-six) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (2") squares.

Fabric #4

Cut two (one) strips $4\frac{1}{2}$ " ($3\frac{1}{2}$ ") wide.

Cut ten (ten) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (2") wide.
